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#### GENERAL INFORMATION

## Eligibility

Any artist 18 years or older may enter two works, any combination of 2D or 3D. Work must be **original**, entirely the work of a single artist, executed within the last 3 years, AAS reserves the right to refuse any work that is not properly presented, requires special installation, or is otherwise unacceptable by the AAS Media Committee. Please carefully read the artwork specifications.

All work must be for sale. AAS will retain a commission of 25% for members and 35% for nonmembers of all sales. The artist is committed to the sale price on the entry form.

#### **Artwork Specifications**

- All 2D artwork must be framed, wired, and ready to hang and must not exceed 15 pounds.
- No saw-tooth hangers are permitted.
- Gallery wrapped canvas must be at least 1.25" deep and all edges must be painted.
- Rigid Plexiglas is required for pieces over 30" in any direction.
- Maximum framed size cannot exceed 50".
- No 3D artwork may exceed 50 pounds.
- Work needing special installation will not be accepted.
- Any artwork requiring lighting must have its own power source.

## LIABILITY

Work is entered at the risk of the artist. Although the utmost care will be taken in handling the work, neither AAS nor its representatives will be responsible for damage or loss from any cause. Submitting a work of art shall imply an agreement on the part of the artist to the conditions set forth in this prospectus.

## **SHOW JUDGES**

## Tony Alderman, 2D Judge:

Tony Alderman is a fine art painter with over 40 years' experience. Attending on full scholarship from the art department, he graduated with his bachelor's degree in fine art from the University of Mobile in Mobile, Alabama in 1985.

Tony was honored with the UMA Art Area award in 1985 as well as the Centennial Award from the Blount Foundation in Alabama. Tony relocated to Durham NC in the fall of 1985.

From 1989 until 2008 Tony was known for his imaginative and distinctive murals. Tony painted commissioned works from upstate New York to Miami Florida including a mural for the home of the late Frank Keenan at Landfall North Carolina. During the introduction of magnet schools in North Carolina Tony was engaged to create a number of multi-wall murals in the schools. Since 2008 Tony's work has evolved and he is primarily painting in a **Post-Modern Industrial Realist** style, working predominantly as a regionalist painter. His focus is on coastal paintings as well as historic town and city life. Tony's work, while beautiful and realistic, is imbued with the emotional connection he feels with his subject. He is drawn by the mystery of life in and around the sea, and how it is reflected in the people and the land. His paintings are a personal quest to better understand and commune with the spirit and unspoken emotion of each boat, building and pier. To Tony they speak; they have a story to tell; they are connected to all the human beings that created, worked and lived and died around them.

## **Tonda Jeffcoat, 3D Judge:**

Growing up in a small town in North Carolina, I was always interested in doing something creative. After high school, I attended Atlantic Christian College (now Barton College) in Wilson, NC, graduating in 1974 with a degree in Art Education. After marrying my high school sweetheart, Joe Jeffcoat, we settled in Wilson, where I taught elementary art for 31 years. The same year I began my teaching career, I took a summer pottery class at Wilson Technical Institute. Soon after, Joe decided to take the class also and those classes would change the course of our lives, leading to a 45-year collaboration of creating functional pottery. Following our retirements, we moved to Little River, SC in 2005 and opened our own studio, Jeffcoat Pottery. Together we taught classes, hosted workshops and sold our work at shows in the region. We were also teachers at John Campbell Folk School for several summers. In 2020, I closed our studio due to the passing of my husband. I continue to make pottery at home and work at Sunset River Gallery in Calabash.
